### Anna Bedynska CLOTHES FOR DEATH

Bedynska explores the traditions surrounding dying and the way in which they prepare one for death. In Poland, there is tradition in preparing clothes for death. Clothes are selected carefully, with much thought and meaning. This particular tradition is still cultivated in little towns and villages, mostly among the older generation. Probably the last one.

World Press Photo winner, Polish photojournalist Anna Bedynnska focuses on social changes in contemporary society; her projects were used as national NGO campaigns to humanise death and childbirth. She has highlighted taboo and sensitive subjects with particular reference to the role of women.

### Astrid Blazsek-Ayala MYTHOLOGICAL IMAGININGS

This work explores the crossover of cultures - the intersections and omissions. Astrid worked with a professional craftsman to create piñatas of figures from Greek mythology. The aim of this project was to contrast the imagination of a person from a country with a Mayan cultural heritage, such as Guatemala, with the fantasies from Greek antiquity, a symbol of Western civilization.

Astrid Blazsek-Ayala is an economist and artist from Guatemala with a PhD in Economics and a degree in Advanced Studies in Photography and Management of Photographic Projects. In 2017, she cofounded the Collective Agalma, Guatemala.






### **Bob Newman** THE IRISH TRAVELLERS

Robert Newman has documented the lives of the Irish Travellers, a historically nomadic group. Though always kept at the margins of society, travellers are a remarkably resilient group who highly prize their culture and family life. They are a beautiful people whose story is largely untold outside Ireland and the United Kingdom. With his photographs, Newman hopes to share the world of the Travellers with others well outside their homeland.

Award-winning American photographer Bob Newman learned photography through workshops and mentoring. His work focuses on storytelling using environmental photography.

### **Brett Leigh Dicks NUCLEAR LANDSCAPES**

'Nuclear landscapes' topographies across the United States associated with atomic energy. Atomic power was once promoted as the epitome of progress and modernity, but with it came threats of nuclear warfare and disaster. Abandoned uranium mining towns, decaying atomic test sites, old nuclear reactors, and decommissioned nuclear missile bases now stand as an eerie testament to a time that was meant to revolutionize civilization.

American-Australian photographer Brett Leigh Dicks has written extensively on the subject of photography along with curating exhibitions for public and private galleries and museums.

### **Brian Cassey** "ME TOO! ... WHERE THE BOYS ARE ... THE GIRLS ARE"

For male burlesque dancers, a large part of their act is to 'interact' with the young and scantily clad female audience – in direct contrast to the #MeToo movement that exploded around the planet. A fascinating insight from both sides - the men who are 'doing a job' and the young women who embrace the 'performance'.

London-born, Cairns-based award-winning photojournalist Brian Cassey has covered momentous events such as the evacuation of refugees from East Timor (1999), victims of the Bali bomb blasts (2002), Boxing Day tsunami (2004) and Australia's detention of asylum seekers on Manus Island.



### Brian Hodges ACHOLILAND - PORTRAITS OF RESISTANCE FROM NORTHERN UGANDA

Conflict and violence have plagued much of Uganda since independence in 1962. Today, ten years after hostilities ended, the region appears rejuvenated. The generation who grew up in refugee camps is receiving education, learning trades and returning to farming land. While many still carry the physical and emotional scars of unconscionable devastation, it is evident that the human spirit is profoundly capable of emerging with resilience after war.

After studying software engineering and telecommunications, Los Angeles-born Brian picked up a friend's camera and a new career direction was born. His work has won awards and been featured in magazines.



### Chris Byrnes PORTRAIT WITHOUT A FACE

Chris planned on photographing her mother before she faded aged 93 years. Her work explores the demise of the human seen through the demise of analogue photography. Each image is a pinhole film negative printed and decayed through traditional analogue processes, echoing the decay of a human life

Chris has been experimenting in photography since 2000, mostly in pinhole, cyanotype, photograms, utilising out of date papers and chemistry. She plays with the notion of the glitch within each handmade work. Chris completed a Master Fine Art in Photography in 2017 and has exhibited nationally and internationally.




### **Daniel Kneebone** ALICE-ISM

An illustration of the age-old 'Alice's Adventures in Wonderland', tackled through the grandeur of theatrical performance with a burlesque twist. The timeless fascination of 'Alice' continues to resonate in today's modern world, as evidenced by the numerous interpretations of the story across many art forms. Daniel uses his artistic skills in digital manipulation to maximize the effect of colour and create a sense of movement and life within the still image.

Melbourne photographer Daniel Kneebone is a multi-award-winning artist who uses his detailed artworks to make a statement about facets of life and art about which he is passionate.

### Dave Tacon SHANGHAI: DECADENCE WITH CHINESE CHARACTERISTICS

Today, Shanghai is one of the most exciting and stylish cities on the planet, as well as one rife with contrasts and contradictions. Young people, whose grandparents starved in the famines of Mao's Great Leap Forward and Cultural Revolution, flaunt their new-found wealth under the gaudy lights of nightclubs. Many believe this wealth and love of excess apparent in Chinese society is the birth of the Chinese Dream.

Shanghai-based photographer Dave Tacon is a two-time Walkley Award winner whose work has been widely published and is held in permanent collections across Australia.



### David Collins BOOCHANI - AURORA FILMS, MANUS ISLAND

Kurdish writer and journalist Behrouz Boochani has gained global prominence as a vocal advocate of refugee rights. The portraits in this exhibition were captured during the final few weeks of his ordeal on Manus Island before he was transferred to Port Moresby and then on to begin the next chapter of his life in exile. The images capture a man with a passionate obsession to tell his story, and who refused to be a victim of circumstance.

David Collins is a portrait photographer based in Sydney. Working with NGOs in developing countries, his documentary work centres on capturing the life of marginalised populations.

## Diana Nicholette Jeon NIGHTS AS INEXORABLE AS THE SEA

The series considers the quirky and unpredictable nature of dreams and memories. Asleep - existing in that liminal space – the photographer is confronted with situations that she can't explain, often fraught with absurdities and illogical occurrences. Was it really a dream, or was it a previously forgotten memory seeping through to the conscious mind?

Diana Nicholette Jeon holds MFA in Imaging and Digital Art and her work has been exhibited extensively in the United States, Canada, and Europe. She has won multiple awards and has been featured in a wide array of publications.

## **Du Choff** AMYGDALA

Du Choff translates his thoughts, feelings and fantasies into portraits. The amygdala is the centre in the brain that is primarily associated with emotional processes and responsible for processing emotions such as fear, anger and pleasure. Paris born - French photographer and filmmaker Flore Vallery-Radot is also a textile journalist and writer. Flore has lived in Sydney for the past nine years.




# **Group exhibition** *WALKLEY'S WATCH AND ACT*




## Lisa Tomasetti THE AUSTRALIAN BALLET ON THE INTERNATIONAL STAGE: CHINA




## Sarah Ducker WOUNDED PLACES

The work of Spanish documentary photographer, Susana Girón, who holds a degree in Photography and Visual Arts has been widely published around the world and won several awards.












#### **Vee Speers** *THE BIRTHDAY PARTY*






#### Yasmin Mund CONCRETE JUNGLE

An intimate and vulnerable look at the pain and heartbreak caused by lost love. Sharing a story that is felt by many, but not often shared. The images depict pain that, while it may not shake society, overwhelms many.

After studying sculpture at university, Yoshi joined an advertising agency photography department; he hated the company, felt lost and couldn't find his direction. He wandered around the world, visiting more than 50 countries. After returning to Japan, he studied photography. He is interested in photographs that tell the truth he cannot tell in commercials.

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
